

## SELF-STUDY GUIDE

### LISTENING

1. Listen to a variety of material from native- and non-native English speakers.
2. Note Volume, Pace, Intonation.
3. Note new vocabulary and phrases.

### SPEAKING & SHADOWING

- Speak and/or Shadow what you heard, using a recording device.
- Compare your speaking to the original speaker, focusing on Volume, Pronunciation, Rhythm, Intonation, and key non-verbal expressions.

### WATCHING

- 1 and 2 (above).
- Observe speaking manner, body language, gesticulation.

### PRACTICE

- Study notes.
- Try to use what you learned in writing and speaking.
- Think about any questions you have about what you've learned, and ask your teacher at next lesson.

### READING

- Note sentence structure, punctuation, logical flow of information.

### APPS

- Note useful vocabulary, phrases, pronunciation, other details.
